

Where should a progress report be published?

This document contains a series of links to sites where you can present your heritage resource's progress report.

The first place the progress should be included in is the heritage resource's own website. In this way, anybody who is interested, or who visits the website can access and get to know about the actions taken and the goals achieved.

On the other hand, there are several options at different levels where the progress report can be published.

International:

- <https://sdgs.un.org/partnerships>: this is a platform designed to include actions that step up achievement of a specific SDG.
- <https://ich.unesco.org/en/register>: this is a part of UNESCO and enables improvements to safeguarding heritage to be registered.
- ICOMOS Heritage Observatory: enables dissemination of information about the heritage's status, management or guardianship.

Spanish State:

- <https://www.mites.gob.es/es/rse/extras/mapaweb/index.htm>: this is the Government vice-president's Social Responsibility portal and gives you the option of adding your sustainability and progress report or memorandum.
- <https://www.culturaydeporte.gob.es/libro-verde-patrimonio/participa.html>: this is a section of the Heritage Green Book. You can take part by uploading the way your association, organisation or entity deals with the challenges of sustainable heritage management.

At regional level, Cordoba Council is committed to promoting the achievement of sustainable development. To do so, it started up the "Multi-player provincial network of SDG supporters": <https://agenda2030.dipucordoba.es/red-provincial-multiactor-de-promotores-de-ods/>

There are **non-profit organisations** that also enable us to share the progress at the heritage resource, such as:

- Hispania Nostra press/Good practices: you need to be a member, but they have a newsletter and a bulletin where its members' activities can be published.
- World Heritage cities network: only focusses on the City of Cordoba.

Furthermore, **academia** is an ideal place to disseminate our progress, meaning that taking part in workshops, conferences, seminars and academic and/or scientific publications is another way of broadcasting the heritage resource's evolution.
